Gospel Reflection

Matt. 22: 1-14

In today's Gospel we hear the parable of the wedding feast and that we are all invited. The king's son was getting married and invitations were issued. His servants went out to call in the guests, but nobody answered the call. The servants went out again but still nobody was interested. Finally, the king sent his servants to the crossroads to invite everyone they could find, and the wedding hall was filled. On closer examination, the king discovered one man without a wedding garment who was then hastily thrown out by the attendants.

In this parable, Jesus is telling us that the emphasis is not really on receiving the invitation but on accepting it. When we accept, it's not just good enough turning up on the day without any preparation like the man without the wedding garment. We must live our lives in the way that the Gospel's show us. We must answer the invitation to attend Mass where we hear the Word of God and receive the Bread of Life. We must also be kind and welcoming, considerate and compassionate, and above all we must be always ready to answer the call to attend that great banquet which awaits us in God's heavenly kingdom.

In this month of October, we pray for our Missionaries, both lay and ordained, who like the king's servants, go out into a sometimes very dangerous and hostile world with open invitations to all to join God's family. They face many challenges as they reach out to those in difficult circumstances. We ask God to be with them, to guide their plans and to bless the work of their hands. Amen.
