#### Saint of the Week - St. Macartan.

St. Macartan was a convert from paganism. He is said to have gone south from his home in the north to hear Patrick preach and that their first meeting took place at Drumlease, near Dromahair. Soon Patrick baptised him and Macartan became Patrick's companion and bodyguard. Because of this, he became known as the "strong man" of Patrick. When Patrick became worn out by his labours, Macartan would carry him on his broad shoulders across rivers and over rough ground. Macartan preached the Gospel in Tyrone and Fermanagh. He died in the year 506 from natural causes and is thought to have been buried at Clogher, Co. Tyrone. Monaghan Cathedral was built high on a hill above the town between 1864 and 1892 and is dedicated to St. Macartan and he is also patron saint of the Diocese of Clogher. His feast day is celebrated on **24**<sup>th</sup> **March**.

# Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel (John 12: 20-30), Jesus tells us that unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains a single grain and cannot bear any fruit. But if it dies then it will give a rich harvest. We too can be compared to a kernel of wheat clinging onto our old life, a life without any future. The grain of wheat "dies" not by falling into the ground but by being stripped away from its head. It becomes viable when it's pulled away from its old source of life and buried in the ground where moisture and nutrients will bring forth its new life.

To get bread we must thresh the wheat. To get wine we must crush the grapes. To get a new life in union with Jesus Christ, the old life must be threshed and buried. We cannot get new life or give new life without some form of dying. Jesus is using the imagery in this Gospel to explain that He must first die on the Cross so that He can rise again to a new life and in so doing, people will believe that He is the Son of God.

#### **ACT OF CONTRITION FOR LENT.**

My God, I'm sorry for my sins with all my heart. I choose to do wrong and failed to do good. I have sinned against You whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend to do penance, to sin no more and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Jesus Christ suffered and died for me. In His name, I ask for mercy. Amen.
