Gospel Reflection.

In today's Gospel (John 2:13-25), Jesus arrived in Jerusalem for a feast called the Passover and went to the Temple. There he found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, which the people used as offerings to God. There were also many money-changers so that pilgrims from different lands could change their money and buy the offerings. They were charging a high price for their services which was not fair on those people who didn't have much money but still wished to worship God. The Temple was a place where people went to pray but some people had turned it into a place of business.

Jesus was angry that His Father's House was being used as a market centre, so He made a whip and drove them all out. This is an example of where actions can speak louder than words. Jesus was standing up for what he believed in - the sacredness of the Temple, and He used His God-given authority to change this challenging situation. By doing this He is carrying out the will of His Father.

Just like Jesus, we too can sometimes become angry and challenged by situations we find ourselves in. We often witness discrimination against certain sectors of society and the unfair treatment of the poor and the marginalised. Perhaps Lent would be a good time for standing up for what we believe in and in finding ways to make our world a fairer and better place for all, and also a time for allowing God's Word to enter our hearts and change our lives too.
