Saint of the Week - St. Bernadette of Lourdes

Born near Lourdes on 17th Jan. 1844. Eldest of a family of five, Bernadette worked in a laundry and helped on the family farm. On 11th Feb. 1858, while gathering firewood, she witnessed her first apparition of Our Lady. Fourteen more apparitions occurred over the following weeks and months. Water started flowing at the location and continues flowing to this day and is the source of the water used at all the baths at Lourdes. Bernadette later joined the Sisters of Charity where she remained until her untimely death in 1879. She was beatified in June 1925 and was canonised to Sainthood by Pope Pius XI on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, 8th Dec. 1933. We celebrate her feast day on 16th April.

DIVINE MERCY

From the diary of a young Polish nun, a special devotion began spreading throughout the world in the 1930s. The message is nothing new but is a reminder of what the Church has always taught through scripture and tradition: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we too must show mercy and forgiveness. But in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on a powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone — especially the greatest sinners.

The message and devotion to Jesus known as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread. The message of mercy is that God loves us — all of us — no matter how great our sins. He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

It is a message we can call to mind simply by remembering A B C:

- **A** Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- **B** Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- **C** Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

GOSPEL REFLECTION - JOHN 20:19-31

After his death and resurrection, Jesus appears to his disciples, and wishes them peace. But one of the disciples wasn't there when Jesus appeared. It was Thomas who was called the twin and when the disciples met him later, he said he would not believe that Jesus was risen from the dead unless he saw it for himself. Thomas wanted to see the holes in Jesus' hand, made by the nails on the cross.

Many of us can empathise with Thomas as we are all a bit like him sometimes. It isn't always easy for us to believe in God and Jesus especially when our faith is tested. Even though we listen to the gospel and hear about God's love for us, it can be difficult to keep believing when things go wrong and we lose hope.

Later Jesus appears to Thomas and shows him the holes in his hands and wishes him peace. Thomas believes and replies with the words "My Lord and my God". Then Jesus say's "How happy are those who believe without seeing me!" From then on Thomas became a model disciple as he preached the Gospel far and near.

We are blessed by God, because we believe in Jesus even though we haven't seen him like the disciples did. This week let do our best to believe that Jesus is the risen Son of God, the same Jesus who is active in all our lives and in the world around us.

Let us also remember God's continuing love for us, even in these difficult and uncertain times and to share the peace of Christ with each other all around the world.
