Gospel Reflection - Luke 24: 35-48

In today's Gospel the two men that met Jesus on the road to Emmaus are now with the Disciples explaining to them what had happened and how they had recognized the Lord when he broke the bread. While they were talking, the Lord suddenly stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were terrified, thinking that they were seeing a ghost. But he said to them, "Why are you alarmed? Why are these doubts coming up in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet and see that it is I myself. Feel me, and you will know, for a ghost doesn't have flesh and bones, as you can see, I have." They were filled with joy and wonder.

Then He said to them, "These are the very things I told you about while I was still with you: everything written about me in the Law of Moses, the writings of the prophets, and the Psalms had to come true." He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and said to them, "This is what is written: the Messiah must suffer and must rise from death three days later, and in his name the message about repentance and the forgiveness of sins must be preached to all nations, beginning in Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

As we continue our journey through this Easter season and through life, Jesus walks by our side and listens to us as a friend and companion just as He walked along with the men on the road to Emmaus. He asks us to tell Him our story and to share with Him what is deepest and most important to us. Each of us have a personal, unique and sacred story. Pope Francis says that, 'Each of us have a story; a story of grace, a story of sin, a story of journey, many things. It is good to pray with our story.'
