Saint of the Week - St. Asicus

St. Asicus is the patron saint of the Diocese of Elphin and is buried at the top of a field between Donegal Town and Ballyshannon near Ballintra. He was a skilled coppersmith and silversmith, and copperwork can be seen on the shamrock patterned beaten brass altar screen in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Sligo. He was one of the earliest of St. Patrick's disciples and after St. Patrick established the diocese of Elphin in Co. Roscommon, he appointed Asicus as it's first bishop. He was later Abbot-Bishop of Ireland. He left Roscommon and travelled to Rathlin O'Birne Island in Donegal Bay where he resigned his office and became a hermit, living for a while at the top of Sliabh League along the area called '*The Pilgrim's Way*.' His feast day is celebrated on <u>27th April.</u>

An Extract from the Message of Pope Francis for Vocations Sunday 2021

"God looks on the heart and in Saint Joseph he recognized the heart of a father, able to give and generate life in the midst of daily routines. Vocations have this same goal: to beget and renew lives every day. The Lord desires to shape the hearts of fathers and mothers: hearts that are open, capable of great initiatives, generous in self-giving, compassionate in comforting anxieties and steadfast in strengthening hopes. The priesthood and the consecrated life greatly need these qualities nowadays, in times marked by fragility but also by the sufferings due to the pandemic, which has spawned uncertainties and fears about the future and the very meaning of life. Saint Joseph comes to meet us in his gentle way, as one of "the saints next door". At the same time, his strong witness can guide us on the journey.

St. Joseph suggests to us three key words for each individual's vocation. The first is dream. Everyone dreams of finding fulfilment in life. We rightly nurture great hopes, lofty aspirations that ephemeral goals – like success, money and entertainment – cannot satisfy. If we were to ask people to express in one word their life's dream, it would not be difficult to imagine the answer: *"to be loved"*. It is love that gives meaning to life because it reveals life's mystery. Indeed, we only have life if we give it; we truly possess it only if we generously give it away. St. Joseph has much to tell us in this regard, because, through the dreams that God inspired in him, he made of his life a gift."

<u>A Prayer for Vocations</u>: Loving God, You speak to us and nourish us through the life of this church community. Lord, we ask you to send your Spirit to us so that men and women among us, young & old, will respond to your call to service and leadership in the Church. We pray, especially, in our day, for those who hear your invitation to be a priest, sister, brother, or deacon. May those who are opening their hearts and minds to your call be encouraged and strengthened through our enthusiasm in your service. Amen.

"I am the Good Shepherd, says the Lord.



I know my own sheep and my own know me." (John 10: 14)

The Church today is in great need of good shepherds who are totally committed to the Way of Jesus. On this Good Shepherd Sunday, we pray that our Christian communities will be graced with good shepherds and pastors. We sometimes tend to narrow the term 'vocation' to those who feel called to the priesthood or religious life whereas in essence every baptised person has a vocation. Everyone is called by God to play a specific role in the Christian community and in the wider community.

Unless we Christians see that 'vocation' is something that we are called to, it is unlikely that there will be enough people to meet the service needs of our Christian communities which can only grow and thrive when every member makes a contribution to the well-being of the whole community.

Jesus is our Good Shepherd and He wants us to follow his example by being

Good Shepherds in the way that we care for others - our brothers and sisters around the world, no matter who they are or where they come from. And he doesn't want us to run away when things are difficult and the going gets tough. That's when we are needed most and when He wants us to stand up for what we believe and know to be right.

On this, the World Day of Prayer for Vocations 2021 we pray for vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life, especially for our diocese.
