Memorial of the Week - Blessed Edmund Rice - 5th May.

Edmund Ignatius Rice was born in Callan, Co. Kilkenny in 1762. After his young wife's early death, he sold his possessions and dedicated his life to the education of the poor. To advance the work he gathered other like-minded men who took religious vows together to work for the Catholic education of boys. He founded two religious congregations devoted to education - the Christian Brothers and the Presentation Brothers. He died in 1844 and was beatified on 6th Oct. 1996 and declared 'Blessed' by Pope John Paul II. One more miracle is required for Sainthood.

The Month of May

The month of May is traditionally dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. May is a month of growth when nature is reborn. This month normally belongs to the Easter season, between Easter and Pentecost. The tradition of dedicating the month of May to Our Lady is centuries old, dating back at least 700 years. Blessed Pope Paul VI wrote an encyclical on the month of May, focusing on the Virgin Mary. He wrote that the piety of the faithful has long dedicated the month of May to the Mother of God. The reason for dedicating May to Our Lady is associated with the particular season of the year. May is certainly known for its springtime beauty. It is associated with flowers and blossoms, with trees which spring back to life, and grass which sprouts. It brings to mind the idea of promise and hope, of new life.

<u>A Prayer to Mary</u>: O Mary, you shine continuously on our journey as a sign of salvation and hope. We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick, who, at the foot of the cross, were united with Jesus' suffering, and persevered in your faith. "Protectress of the Roman people", you know our needs, and we know that you will provide, so that, as at Cana in Galilee, joy and celebration may return after this time of trial. Help us, Mother of Divine Love, to conform ourselves to the will of the Father and to do what Jesus tells us. For He took upon Himself our suffering, and burdened Himself with our sorrows to bring us through the cross, to Resurrection joy. Amen.

"I am the Vine, and you are the branches.



Remain in me as I remain in you, and you will bear much fruit."

(John 15: 5)

In today's Gospel (John 15: 1-8) Jesus is teaching his disciples and He calls them and us His branches because He supports us, like a tree trunk supports its branches. And He wants us to bear fruit for Him by staying close to Him and following his teachings. This means being the best we can be, loving each other, and loving the beautiful world he has given us.

He is within us, in each other, in our community, in those outside our community. By becoming the 'Word Incarnate' He has become incarnate in every human being. And this is why today Jesus says that "You cannot separate the vine from the branches and you cannot separate the branches from the vine." We are dependent on Jesus, but also God Himself has made Himself dependent on us. For the vine, there are the branches, and the branches bear fruit, and the fruit is the fruit of the Kingdom, and the work of the Kingdom is what He came for. But the work of the Kingdom is now given to us, for we will walk and talk, we will forgive and care, we will be the ones that carry the message of Jesus to others. He will be with us, but it is our turn to walk the way He walked, to care the way He cared, to love the way He loved. And this is the way that the Kingdom of God shall flourish throughout the world.
