philosophies, he acknowledged Christ as the source of
all truth. A lay intellectual, Christian philosopher, and
apologist. Noted for his reasoned defence of Christian
belief and practice and for the ultimate witness given by
his martyrdom. The Church calls him the patron of
philosophers and he is a worthy model for all who seek
the truth amid the myriad ideas which surround us today.
His feast day is celebrated on 1st June.

30th May 2021 – Holy Trinity Sunday – Year B

The Father - The Son - The Holy Spirit

Today we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday, and if we think back to Ascension Day, Jesus made a reference to the Trinity in some of His last words to the Apostles when He instructed them to baptise in "*the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.*" This directive is why baptisms today are still done in this exact same way. These words are familiar and straightforward enough to us, but they are packed with both meaning and mystery. They profess our fundamental belief that there is one God who exists in three distinct persons. The Trinity can be a confusing doctrine of our faith because it is a mystery that we may find difficult to fully understand because God is infinite and, therefore, beyond our finite comprehension. If we could fully understand God, then that would make us equal to or greater than God. Still, that does not mean we are totally in the dark. God has revealed Himself to us and the Church has preserved and sought to understand that revelation as best as possible.

There is only one God. We profess this every time we begin the creed: "*I believe in one God...*" We do not worship three different Gods. This one God is not solitary but is, in His essence, a communion of persons, a triune God. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are all fully God but distinct from one another. The Father is not the same as the Son and the Son is not the same as the Holy Spirit, etc. These three divine persons are one in substance. As we say in the creed, the Son is "*consubstantial*" or one in being with the Father. The Trinity is a mystery and a truth which we may not fully grasp, but we are called to have a relationship with the Trinity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Trinity is a communion of love and completeness and today we are invited to be a part of that divine communion.

The Trinity Prayer

Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the Three in One and One in Three, bound together in one eternity of love. We worship you God the creator of all things. We praise you Christ our redeemer and friend. We give you thanks Holy Spirit, our strength and guide.

To you be all praise, honour and glory today and forevermore. Amen.
