MEMORIAL OF THE WEEK OUR LADY OF FATIMA - 13TH MAY.

Our Lady of Fatima Shrine is a pilgrimage shrine in Northern Portugal dating from the 1917 apparitions of the Virgin Mary to three shepherd children. It is significant for its call to conversion, the consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the recitation of the rosary, prayers for world peace and the three secrets revealed there. Lúcia Santos and her two cousins, Jacinta and Francisco Marto were three shepherd children to whom Our Lady appeared at Fatima on the 13th day of six consecutive months starting on 13th May 1917. The visions of Fatima were officially declared "worthy of belief" by the Church in Oct. 1930. Both Francisco and Jacinta died young from influenza and are buried in Fatima Basilica and were beatified on 13th May 2000. Lúcia became a Carmelite nun and died on 13th Feb. 2005 and was beatified on 13th Feb. 2008. *Our Lady of Fatima, pray for us.*

A Rosary for the World

The month of May is the month of Our Lady, Mary Our Mother. Pope Francis has asked that this year, the month of May will be dedicated as a “*marathon of prayer*”; he asks us to pray for an end to the pandemic which has affected the family of our world for more than a year. Pope Francis wants to involve all the Shrines to Our Lady throughout the world. In the light of the scripture; “*Prayer by the Church was fervently made to God*” Acts 12:5. All people of faith are asked to join in this rosary of the world in all the languages of the world. As well as the prayer of the Rosary, each day is characterized by a prayer intention for the various categories of people most affected by the pain of this pandemic for instance: those who have not been able to say goodbye to their loved one..... all health care workers..... for the poor..... and so on. The World Rosary will take place in Knock on this Monday 10th May. The intention of that day is for all those who live with disability or underlying conditions. Each Shrine is called to promote as much as possible the participation of the faithful, so that everyone can devote a moment to daily prayer, in the car, on the street, and thanks to communication technologies, with the smartphone, requesting the end of the pandemic and the resumption of social and work activities. Pope Francis has blessed special Rosaries used particularly for this event which have been sent to thirty Shrines directly involved including Knock.

“Love one another as I have loved you.” (John 13:34)

In today’s Gospel (*John 15: 9-17*), Jesus is telling us that He loves us very much and that we in turn should “*love one another.*” We know that love is much more than just a feeling. It is very much self-giving and active. When Jesus calls us to love one another in the Church, He is giving us a calling that is not easy and can be difficult to do on our own. It is only the love of God working in us that makes it possible for us to truly and selflessly love others.

Jesus also says, “*Remain in My love.*” We must be full of Jesus’ love to have any love to give to others and we remain in His love by keeping His commandments. We manifest God’s love best when we are in a right relationship with Him. Sin or breaking the commandments often separates us from God and can prevent, by our own choice, the love of God from effectively working in and through us. But when we obey God’s commandments and bring into line our will with His will, then we can truly love one another. When we let God’s love fill us and spill out into others, then it is amazing what the power of God can do through us. The reality is that it is hard to love as God calls us to, but with God all things are possible because God is love and His love is everlasting. Jesus died out of perfect love for us and because of His death we can have life in Him that brings life to others.

Prayer for the Week: Dear God, help me to receive and know your love and to selflessly share that love with others. Amen.
