

Gospel Reflection

Mark 10: 35-45

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is journeying to Jerusalem and His words to his closest disciples seem to be intended to prepare them for the events that will occur there. James and John ask to be given seats of honour when Jesus enters into his glory. Once again, the disciples seem to be selective in what they hear Jesus say. They want to share Jesus' glory, but do not appear to understand that before glory will come suffering. Jesus notes their lack of understanding and predicts the suffering they will endure for the sake of the Gospel. He also says that

the honour they seek is not His to give.

When the other ten hear what James and John have asked, they are annoyed, but Jesus takes the opportunity to teach them. He explains the importance of service and sacrifice in the life of a disciple. In particular, he seems to be preparing the Twelve for their leadership roles in their new Christian community. Jesus also acknowledges that his teaching is somewhat different than that of the civil rulers of the time. Following Jesus' example of sacrificial love continues to be different to political standards in our day as well. The best way to serve God is to serve others. Therefore, let us seek to become servants instead of masters and through this may we be one of those who will sit on the

right or the left side of Jesus in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Saint of the Week - St John Paul II

Born Karol Józef Wojtyla in Poland on 18th May 1920. In 1978 he became the first non-Italian pope in more than 400 years. He was a vocal advocate for human rights and influenced political change. John Paul II died on 2nd April 2005 at the age of 84. On 5th July 2013, waving the usual five-year waiting period, the Vatican announced that the Roman Catholic Church would declare Pope John Paul II a saint. He was beatified in 2011 by his successor Pope Benedict XVI and canonised in 2014 by Pope Francis. He is co-patron of World Youth Day and his feast day is celebrated on 22nd Oct.
