# Gospel Reflection

Mark 10: 46-52

Today's Gospel is telling us of an encounter between Jesus and a blind man called Bartimaeus along the side of the road. The man was shouting and asking for Jesus to have pity on him, and even though he was blind he recognises in Jesus someone who could heal him. The crowd however were embarrassed and tried to silence him. Bartimaeus doesn't give up, and because of his persistence, his cries eventually reach Jesus who say's "What do you want me to do for you?" to which the blind man replies "Master, let me see again." Jesus then says to Bartimaeus: "Go; your faith has saved you." and with his sight restored, he follows Jesus along the road.

Our modern secular culture is often blind to the deeper spiritual realities of life. Through Jesus we recognise that there is a Light that can guide our lives and heal us if only we call upon it. Jesus is constantly telling us that we should persist in our prayers and that we will be answered. Spiritually speaking, do we really see our darkness and our need of repentance? God offers us forgiveness and healing, and He calls us to be part of His family. We pray for the gift of saving faith and for the light of truth so that we also can follow our loving Lord, Jesus Christ.

# Saint of the Week - St Colman

Colman was born in 560 in Kilmacduagh, Co. Clare. After studying in Aran, where he founded two churches on Inis Mór, he returned to become a hermit near Kinvarra. Induced later to undertake the monastic life he made a foundation at Kilmacduagh. He is said to have been its first abbot and bishop and had a reputation for being a vegetarian and having a great love of birds and animals. He died in 632 and his feast day is celebrated on 29th Oct.
