Saint of the Week - St. Martin of Tours

Martin was born in Hungary about 316; A catechumen who was baptised at the age of 18, for a time became a hermit, worked to establish monasticism in the West and was Bishop of Tours in France for twenty five years. Widely remembered for his legendary generosity to the poor, for arguing against the persecution of heretics, and especially for his active evangelisation and pastoral care of rural areas. He is the first non-martyr to be honoured as a saint. He died in 397 and his feast day is celebrated on **11**th **Nov**.

Gospel Reflection - Mark 12: 38-44.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is observing what goes on in the treasury. He notices that rich are putting in large sums of money while those who had less naturally put in smaller amounts. It is very much a case of the rich versus the poor. The widow in the Gospel puts in two small coins and is representative of the poor and marginalised in society. Her financial contribution is deemed insignificant. But the poor didn't go unnoticed by Jesus. He focuses on the poor and marginalised rather than on the rich and the famous because the rich are not necessarily the ones who will give generously. Jesus upholds the widow's contribution. Her small offering was about much more than the monetary value. It was an act of profound generosity, giving from her livelihood rather than from surplus wealth. She gave all that she had, didn't hold anything back even if it meant that she had nothing to live on to look after herself. She has great faith and trust in God.

Our faith requires of us to give our entire selves without holding back. If we give all that we have, God can work marvels with what we have to offer Him along as we give from the heart with love and devotion towards Him. A gift that is given out of love and generosity is invaluable and requires sacrifice. Learning to give generously to God and to others is a difficult lesson to master and requires self-denial. As Jesus reminds us, anyone who wants to be follower of His must take up his cross. Jesus gave of Himself to us on the cross. This generous self-giving of Himself was so that we would receive salvation and eternal life.
