21st Nov. 2021 – Feast of Christ, the Universal King - Year B

Gospel Reflection - John 18: 33-37

In today's Gospel we hear an extract from St. John's version of the Lord's Passion which is read in full on Good Friday. Jesus is being judged as he stands before Pilate, facing trial for claiming to be King of the Jews. Pilate has to make a decision to forgive or to condemn but he passes on that decision to the gathered crowd who shout "Crucify him, Crucify Him." Pilate sides with the crowd and condemns Jesus to death.

Often when we think of Kings we think of royalty, power, money and status, but not this King, our King. He was born into poverty in a lonely stable in mid-winter, but He became a great leader and King who brought justice, truth, peace, hope and love to the whole world. But His Kingdom was not of this world. An innocent man put on trial and put to death on a cross. His crown had no jewels or gold but a twist of thorns. But the truth came out and goodness triumphs over evil. Jesus rose from the dead so that we too may share the inheritance of God's Kingdom.

Jesus is our supreme King, and He is to be loved, obeyed and honoured above all others because He alone can bring us to eternal life. He is our hope, and we must be witnesses to His eternal and universal sovereignty. Through the spiritual power of prayer, we can bring light into a dark world. We must let our lives be ruled by His Spirit which will guide and help us in some small way to help spread His Kingdom of truth, life, holiness, grace, justice, love and peace.

"Jesus, remember me when You come into your Kingdom".
