#### Trocaire - Special Appeal

The Bishops of Ireland have called for a national Church collection on the 6th and 7th Nov to support Trócaire in providing life-saving aid to vulnerable communities in East Africa and DRC, where millions of people are being pushed to the edge of starvation. #### **Easing of Restrictions**

On Oct  $22^{nd}$  the government guidelines allowed the easing of restrictions. The parishes received instructions from the Bishop's Office. "We still need to keep churches safe places so that parishioners can gather with confidence in bigger numbers. We will continue with many of the useful practices which have been developed during the pandemic:"

- Wearing of facemasks.
- Sanitizers remain in place and people are asked to use them
- Use all the designated seats in the church to sit and not sit close beside people from other households
- Collections will continue to be taken up at church doors
- There will be no sign of peace and no handshaking at removals/funerals
- Holy Communion must continue to be received in the hand
- People are asked to keep their distance from other family groups when entering and leaving the church and when receiving Holy Communion
- Cleaning will continue between liturgical celebrations
- We will continue to rely upon our volunteer stewards

## Gospel Reflection

Mark 12: 28-34

In today's Gospel a scribe asks Jesus about the first of all the commandments and Jesus' answer is to firstly love God and secondly to love your neighbour and this love must be given with all your heart, understanding and strength. The scribe fully accepts and recognises the complete truthfulness in Jesus' reply. After that, no one dared to question Jesus anymore.

In our world and society today, the teachings and the commandments of God have come to seem to be somewhat ignored. Many questions are asked, and people have very strong opinions. The teachings of the church are often challenged and questioned and there is a disregard for human life and for neighbour. Small disagreements can sometimes lead to the taking of life.

God is love and his love is everlasting. Everything He does flows from His love for us. God loved us first and our love for him is a response to his endless grace and kindness towards us. The love of God comes first, and the love of neighbour is firmly grounded in the love of God. The better we understand God's love and truth, the more we love what He loves and the more we reject what is contrary to His will. The love of God is so great that he sacrificed his only begotten Son so that we may have life and live it to the full. God has created us to lovingly serve Him and to lovingly serve others - our neighbours.

## Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls

From twelve o'clock noon on 1st Nov. until midnight on 2nd Nov., all who have confessed, received Holy Communion and prayed for the Pope's intentions (one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice) can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church or oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed. The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1st to 8th Nov. The conditions mentioned above apply also for this.
