#### The Holy Rosary

The word rosary means "Crown of Roses", that is to say that every time people say the rosary devoutly, they place a crown of one hundred and fifty-three white roses and sixteen red roses upon the head of Jesus and Mary. Being heavenly these roses will never fade or lose their exquisite beauty. The Rosary is a meditative prayer based on Scripture. When we pray the Rosary, we ask Mary to pray for us as we seek to grow closer to her son Jesus by contemplating His life, death, and Resurrection. In his 2002 apostolic letter, Pope John Paul II wrote that with the Rosary, "the Christian people sits at the school of Mary and is led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love." The Rosary remains an important prayer today. In May 2022, Pope Francis called on Christians to pray "the Holy Rosary for peace" in response to the war in Ukraine. Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us.

# Gospel Reflection

Luke 18: 1-8

In today's Gospel we hear about justice and the importance of continuous prayer. There was an unjust or corrupt judge in who's court a poor widow would have had little or no chance of having her case dealt with fairly. The widow was ignored by the law, but she didn't give up. She just kept asking the judge to make things right. Eventually, just to get rid of her, he gave her what she wanted, justice. Her prayers were finally answered. The widow is a great example of perseverance - she simply won't be put off and finally the judge gives in. Jesus is not saying that God is like the unjust judge, but he is asking how many people would be willing to persevere as the woman did. Those who seem to have little power can win out in the end if they have the courage to persist in their struggles for justice.

But if this bad judge eventually did the right thing, how much more will God, who is all-powerful and good, do what is right. Jesus' concern is that if we don't get what we pray for the first time, we might just give up. He tells us that God hears the cries of all who call out to him day and night. God will certainly answer our prayers, even if it's not always in the way that we expect, for God knows us better than we know ourselves. Not only does Jesus teach about prayer but he is depicted as a man of prayer. His focus is on the attitude of the one praying rather than on God. So, just like the widow in the Gospel, we should be persistent in prayer and remember that its purpose is not to change God but to change us.

### Our Prayer for the Week

Dear Lord, we thank you for our own justice system in our country. We ask you to comfort those who have been wrongly treated. We ask you to be there in the cracks of our own mechanisms of justice, guiding those who lead, inspiring them to remember your infinite love, giving strength to those who have done wrong, and remind us all that we are built to become part of this love. Amen.
