#### Saint of the Week - St Otteran

Otteran, also known as Odhran or Oran was a monk and a descendant of Conall Gulban. He preceded Colum Cille in Iona and spent many years travelling around Scotland as an evangelical missionary. His death is recorded in 548 and his grave was greatly revered in Iona. He was chosen by the Vikings as patron of the city of Waterford in 1096 and later as Patron Saint of the Diocese of Waterford and Lismore. His feast day is celebrated on 27<sup>th</sup> Oct.

# **Gospel Reflection**

#### Luke 18: 9-14

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the proud Pharisee who prayed

from his self-importance and the tax collector who prayed humbly. In contrasting the two types of prayer, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray in humility before God. He surprises his listeners by showing the tax collector as the example of faith, rather than the Pharisee. As a group during the time of Jesus, the Pharisees interpretated the Law of Moses on the basis of piety, self-righteousness and very public displays of personal prayer and worship.

From the general public point of view, if anyone would be a model for prayer,

a Pharisee was a likely candidate. However Jesus, who so often turned society's ideas upside down, offers the tax collector who recognises his own sinfulness as a model for prayer. Tax collectors at that time worked for the Roman authorities and were often corrupt in their dealings with the public. Yet, in this parable, Jesus offers the humility and the unassuming nature of

the tax collector as an example for the prayer of a good disciple. The parable reminds us that when we pray, we must remember our continuous need for God in our lives. If we are too proud and full of ourselves, then

there is too little room for God's grace to work within us.

The Gospel contains two important phrases which are very relevant to our lives. The first one for inclusion in our daily prayers - "God, be merciful to me, a sinner," the second one to create an awareness within us that - "He who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be


