# Gospel Reflection

Luke 17: 5-10

In today's Gospel the apostles are asking Jesus to increase their faith. His response is that even if they only had faith the size of a mustard seed, they could tell a mulberry tree to move from where it is in the ground and plant itself in the sea. A mustard seed is one of the smallest of seeds, so Jesus is saying that even if we have only a small amount of faith, we can do amazing things. Even if we can't move trees, we might be able to make big changes to the world around us. Sometimes when life gets difficult for us, it can be hard to sustain our faith in God and just like the apostles, we too can have moments when we think that we haven't enough faith.

In the second part of this Gospel the disciples and we too are asked to try and understand that we are all servants to God and His plans. Even when God works wonders through us, with our mustard seed-sized faith, we must not seek praise as we are only doing our duty. Our participation in God's plans is God's grace to us -nothing more -nothing less. When we cooperate with God, the work we do is nothing more than our obligation to God as His faithful stewards. Our faith enables us to believe that what we have offered in service to God, as his servants, can be made to produce a hundredfold. We are here to serve, and God will do the rest.

Dear God, help us to be thankful and happy that You have chosen us to be Your servants. Help us to remain faithful to You, truly humble in spirit and strong in faith even when we are discouraged by the failure of our efforts and the criticisms of others.
