### Saint of the Week - St. Andrew

St. Andrew was a fisherman in Galilee, along with his brother, Peter, when they were called by Jesus to leave their boat and become fishers of men. According to Christian tradition St. Andrew went out into Greece and Turkey to preach the Good News. It is believed that he was martyred by crucifixion in Patras on an X-shaped because Andrew said he was not worthy to die on the same style of cross as Jesus. He is the patron Saint of Scotland, the country's flag bearing the X-shaped cross associated with him. Legends claim that the saint either travelled to Scotland to spread the Gospel or that his relics were brought there by St. Regulus who set out and was shipwrecked on the coast of Scotland. The relics of St. Andrew are now kept at a shrine in Patras in western Greece. His feast day is celebrated on **30<sup>th</sup> Nov.**

### **ADVENT**

The word ‘Advent’ is from the Latin ‘Adventus,’ meaning ‘coming.’ Advent marks the beginning of a new Church year and lasts from the 4<sup>th</sup> Sun. before Christmas, until the celebration of the Nativity of Our Lord. Advent is a period of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to the time when Christ will come again and to the remembrance and celebration of the first coming of Christ to us at Christmas. The advent wreath has a rich meaning. The circle of the wreath, with no beginning or end, symbolises the eternity of God. The evergreen reminds us of the everlasting life we have in Christ while any pine-cones or pods represent new life and resurrection. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. Purple is traditionally a colour of penance and prayer while the rose/pink candle that is lit on the Third Sunday marks our joy as we move ever closer to Christmas.

### GOSPEL REFLECTION

In today's Gospel (Matt. 24: 37-44), the emphasis is on the second coming of Jesus. Three events are described which show that we do not know when Jesus will return, but the message is clear: we are to be ready! The first reference is to Noah and the flood. People were occupied with their daily lives—eating, drinking, and marrying. They were completely unaware of what lay ahead - the flood came and wiped them out. In the second example, men were working in the field and women were grinding at the mill. Some were taken and some remained. In the final example, the master of the house could have prevented the robbery if only he had known when the thief would come. This Gospel is a stern caution for each of us to live in preparation for Jesus' return.

We often feel that there is more work to do in a day than we will ever get done. There are always bills to pay, laundry to wash, meals to prepare, shopping to be done, places to go, people to visit and things to fix. Unless we deliberately set aside time to prepare ourselves and our families for Jesus' return, we will continue with the busyness of everyday life like the people of Noah's time and the workers in the field and at the mill. We are therefore asked not to miss the next four weeks of Advent and its joyful and hopeful message. As followers of Jesus, we are asked to prepare and get ready as best we can.
