Saint of the Week - St. Hilary

Hilary was born in 315 at Poitiers in central France of wealthy pagan parents. Had a good secular education in rhetoric and philosophy, married early in life and had a daughter Afra. His reading of the Scriptures, especially the Prologue to John's Gospel brought him to Christianity at the age of thirty-five. Three years later, while still a layman, he was elected bishop of Poitiers in 353. Although in character Hilary was gentle and courteous, his theological writings show a sharpness of tone against his opponents and are difficult to the point of obscurity. Hilary also composed some of the earliest Latin Christian poems and hymns. Worn out by his travels and struggles, Hilary died in 367 and his feast is celebrated on 13th Jan.

8th January 2023 Baptism of the Lord – Year A

Carrigallen ~ **Drumeela** ~ **Drumreilly**

In today's Gospel Jesus comes to the river Jordan to be baptised by John the Baptist. However, John feels that it is himself that needs to be baptised by Jesus instead of the other way round. But Jesus persuades John to baptise Him and as Jesus leaves the water, the Spirit of God like a dove descends on Him and a voice from heaven is heard saying "This is my Son, the beloved; my favour rests on Him."

This feast day of the Baptism of Jesus marks the transition from the Christmas

season back to Ordinary Time and also marks the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus. John the Baptist, the forerunner, was preparing the way for Jesus by preaching repentance and baptizing people in the river Jordan as they acknowledged their sins. John also proclaimed that one greater than he would come and "baptize you with the Holy Spirit". Jesus certainly was not baptized for forgiveness of sins, since He Himself was sinless so there was no need for Him to repent. But by receiving Baptism He showed His solidarity with sinful humanity and gave an indication of His role as our Saviour. This event also reveals His identity as the Son of God through the voice coming from Heaven and brings to light the Trinity through the action of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit seen at the baptism. Jesus' baptism also heralds the Sacrament of Baptism that He would institute, in which we receive the Holy Spirit and become the adopted children of God.

Since most of us were baptized as infants, we do not remember the event. Yet, no matter what age you were baptized, it still has the same effects: cleansing of sin, imparting of grace, giving of the Holy Spirit, adoption as a child of God, and incorporation into the Church. Today we should take time to thank God for the gift of Baptism and to reflect on the importance of our own Baptism. It's the starting point for our life-long relationship with God and like all relationships it takes work. So, this week let us make an extra effort to invest time and energy into our relationship with God and ask for His grace to help us grow closer to Him.
