Saint of the Week - St. Francis de Sales

Francis de Sales was born in Savoy (France) in 1567. As a presbyter and as bishop of Geneva, he played a major part in the renewal of 17th-century French Catholicism. Seen by many as an early proponent of ecumenical dialogue. His writings promoted a spirituality for laypeople. Honoured as a most influential preacher, writer, and spiritual director, who combined firmness with patience and gentleness. Because of his writings and his idea of distributing pamphlets, Francis de Sales is the patron saint of journalists. Every year since 1967, on his feast day, the Pope issues a Message in preparation for Communications Sunday. Francis died following a stroke in Lyons in 1622 and his feast day is celebrated on 24th Jan.

Gospel Reflection

(Matt. 4: 12-23)

In today's Gospel we witness the start of Jesus' public ministry following his baptism and his return from the desert. We hear that John the Baptist has been arrested, so Jesus moves to the lakeside town of Capernaum in Galilee. This is fulfilling the prophesy of Isaiah which has foretold us that "the people that lived in darkness have seen a great light". Jesus is that great light which will now move among the people.

Before Jesus formally starts his public ministry, he will need some help, so he does a bit of recruiting. Firstly, he meets two fishermen, Simon (also called Peter) and his brother Andrew who were casting their nets and says to them "Follow me and I will make you fishers of men" which they do immediately. A bit further on, he meets two more men, James and John, in a boat mending their nets. Again, they answer his call and follow him. Jesus must have had an immensely powerful and appealing presence to obtain such an immediate and positive response from his first disciples.

Today, two thousand years later, we as Christians are still being asked to follow Jesus as he continues to call us by our name. He invites us to follow him with the words: "if you want to be my disciples, come, take up your cross and follow me."

Prayer for Sunday of the Word of God

O Word that shapes our liturgies and litanies, may we see you not as a dusty book but as a living invitation to an ongoing conversation. O God who comes to us in sacred story, may we find our own stories within your pages. O Word that illuminates our darkness, may we carry your light into the world. O God who speaks into silence, may we rest in the comfort of your voice. O Word made flesh who dwells among us, may we sense your presence with us on the road to Emmaus. And when our hearts burn within us, may we not only hear your Word, but speak it with our lives. Amen.
