GOSPEL REFLECTION (Matt. 16: 21-27)

"Take up your cross and follow me"

In today's Gospel, Jesus confides in His disciples about the eventual outcome of his earthly ministry i.e. that He first must suffer grievously and die in Jerusalem in order to be raised on the third day. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely, calling him "Satan." By disagreeing with Jesus, Peter shows that he is no longer speaking based on the revelation from God but as a human being. The common view at the time was that the Messiah would be a political figure, a king that would free Israel from Roman rule. This is also what Peter thought when he was led to recognize Jesus as the Messiah.

However, Jesus would be more like a servant than a political liberator and He now begins to teach his disciples that he would be the Messiah in a different way. He tells them that to be Christ's disciple is to follow in His way of the cross and that anyone who loses his life for the sake of Jesus will save it. To be a true disciple of Jesus is to take up a life of sacrifice and service to others as Jesus did. We are promised that all who suffer for the kingdom will be generously rewarded. Following Jesus means being prepared to put other's needs before our own. This is not always easy, but Jesus will always be with us to help us along the way.

Prayer for the Week: O God, whose word burns like a fire within us, grant us a bold and faithful spirit, that in your strength we may be unafraid to speak your word and follow where you lead. Through Christ, our Lord. *AMEN*.
