SAINT OF THE WEEK - SAINT FÉCHÍN OF FORE

Féchín was born at Ballisodare, Co. Sligo. He was trained by St. Nathy of Achonry. After becoming a priest, he founded many monasteries throughout Ireland, his first and most famous being located at Fore, Co. Westmeath and another one at Cong, Co. Mayo. Féchín was one of the most active and influential of the Seventh Century Irish Saints. One of the miracles associated with him was the healing of a man who suffered from palsy and deafness from birth. After a life of sanctity, he died in 665 during the time of the Yellow Plague which caused widespread mortality, much social disruption and abandonment of religious faith. We celebrate his Feast Day on **20**th **January**.

RISKING IT IN 2024

Two seeds lay side by side in the fertile soil. The first seed said 'I want to grow! GOSPEL REFLECTION

In today's Gospel (John 1: 35-42) John the Baptist is talking to two of his disciples, Philip and Andrew. Jesus passes by and John realizes that he has taught all that he can and encourages the disciples to continue following Jesus who asks them what they are "looking for" and they answer, "Where do you stay?" This seemingly casual conversation is actually a serious meditation about the meaning of a vocation. Jesus isn't simply asking them why they are following him. He is questioning whether they are seeking something more in life. They have jobs already as they are experienced fishermen. Jesus tests them to see if they will accept religious duties. Will they commit to new careers?

Jesus does not force them to follow Him. He simply says to them that if they want to know who He is, then they are welcome to go with Him and to spend some time with Him. The best way to get to know someone is to live with them. After their time with Jesus, Andrew went and told his brother Peter about Jesus and brings him to meet Jesus. Andrew has now become a missionary disciple and shares with Peter what he himself experienced from being with Jesus.

Today, the same invitation is offered to us by Jesus - come follow me. He is asking us to become His missionary disciples. Whether we accept or not is left entirely up to ourselves. Through prayer we can both talk and listen to Jesus. If we accept the invitation, our lives will be changed and just like Andrew in the Gospel we too will want to share the Good News with others.
