# GOSPEL REFLECTION

In today's Gospel (Mark 1: 14-20) John the Baptist is arrested and Jesus moves his preaching ministry to Galilee where He focuses on the kingdom of God which He states is close at hand and He asks the people to repent and believe the Gospel. To repent means to change one's ways by turning away from sin and turning towards God. So, Jesus is calling people to turn from their sinfulness and follow Him and in so doing we can participate in His kingdom. We are also called to turn away and detach ourselves from the things of this world.

This is what the brothers Simon and Andrew and James and John did in today's Gospel. They were going about their daily business of fishing to make a living. But then they encountered the Messiah, which changed their lives forever. Jesus called them to a different lifestyle of being "fishers of men." In other words, He called them to be ministers in His kingdom. And they immediately dropped everything, leaving livelihood and family behind, to follow Him.
