### GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today's Gospel (Mark 1: 29-39) is a follow on from last week's Gospel where we heard about Jesus exercising his authority and power through casting out a demon from a possessed man. This week we hear about Jesus continuing to perform miracles. Firstly, He goes with James & John to the house of Simon & Andrew where Simon's mother-in-law is in bed with a fever and is immediately healed by Jesus. Next, the word gets out and the whole town brings those who are sick or possessed by demons to Him. Jesus continues to show his authority by healing many.

Through Jesus's miracles he revealed his identity as the Messiah and God in the flesh. It is through His divine nature that he performed these miracles. Jesus continued to preach, heal, and set free those afflicted by evil throughout His earthly ministry in Galilee. In doing so, He prepared the way for His ultimate demonstration of His divine power and authority in dying and rising from the dead to bring the ultimate healing and freedom from the affliction of sin in our lives. Let us, therefore, have complete trust in his saving power. This Gospel shows us that God has the power to overcome anything. Whatever we are going through, we can trust in God's power and have the assurance that He has everything in control.

And finally, the Gospel also tells us that Jesus went to a quiet place to pray amidst the busyness of His Public Ministry. For us too, it's important to drag ourselves away from the busyness of our daily lives to somewhere quiet where we can pray from the heart. God is always listening!
