Is that the end of Easter?

We have an early Easter this year. The weather doesn't correspond to the season. We hope and pray for an improvement. Our world seems to be upside down at the minute, but we have the good news of the Gospel which speaks of love and forgiveness. Once again at Easter we are reminded about the core of our hope and faith which is best expressed by St. Paul. "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is empty, but we know that Christ has been raised from the dead the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep". It's only in the light of the Risen Christ we have the confidence to meet the challenges and difficulties in our lives and the many struggles we see other people make.

The unfortunate innocent people caught up in war and conflict. We are called by virtue of our baptism to bring the light of Christ to a darken and broken world. We do this in the ordinary everyday things in life. It's interesting that when the apostles met Jesus after his resurrection it was in the ordinary. They met him in a garden as Mary Magdalene did when she may have been tidying or watering the flowers. The two disgruntled disciples met him on the road to Emmaus. We find the resurrection anytime we are uplifted in love and prayer, when we are just and kind, when we forgive and live in peace. The big gift the risen Lord gives us is peace. He says many times, "Peace I leave you". So, these Easter days we open ourselves to the life and breath of peace in the Risen Christ. We remember the prayer of St Francis: "Lord make me a means of your Peace".
